We fight hunger by securing, warehousing and distributing much-needed food and grocery items to a variety of agencies that work directly with Oklahomans in need. We feed hope by raising public awareness about hunger and the role of food banking in alleviating hunger.

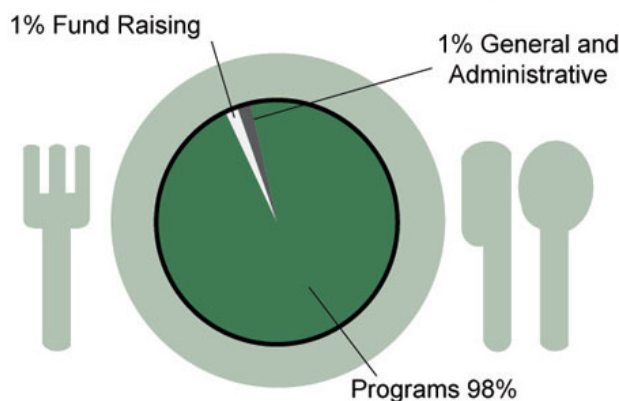
During the 2008 – 2009 fiscal year (FY 09), the Food Bank:

- Distributed almost 13 million pounds of food
- Fed an average of 50,000 Oklahomans every week through our Partner Programs
- Provided the equivalent in food of 621,000 meals a month
- Children and seniors make up 53 percent of our recipients

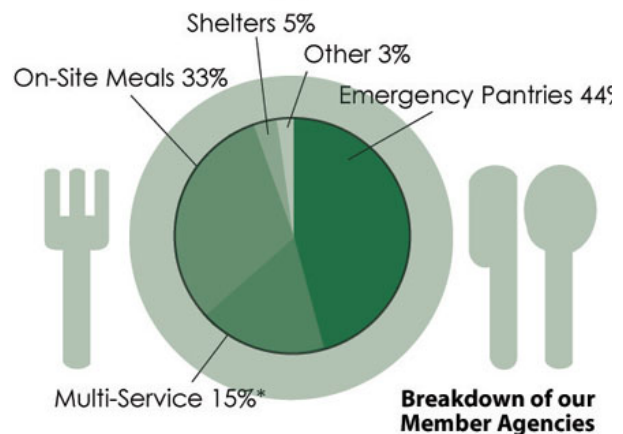
Because of our sound financial management and strong commitment to our vision and mission, **only two percent of our total resources goes toward administration and fund raising, allowing us to devote 97 percent of our resources to fighting hunger and feeding hope.**

***53 percent of the people who receive food from the Food Bank are outside the normal working age, with 39 percent of them children and 14 percent of them seniors.***
